Requirements:

- English language fluency.
- Willingness to seek part-time on-campus employment to provide for personal needs.
- Willingness to engage in regular communication with program coordinators.

Selection Criteria:

- Demonstrates academic proficiency.
- Demonstrates leadership experience.
- Enthusiasm for experiencing the American free-market economy and culture.
