Characteristics:

The obligatory course provides the students with theoretical knowledge and practical skills of care for victims during different types of emegrencies (life-threatening conditions, sudden illnesses, injuries). In practical lessons the students learn CPR in adults and children and the main principles of immobilization and bandaging techniques.

Lectures:

- 1. Introduction to First Aid, the meaning and the types of First Aid. Action at an emergency.
- 2. Respiratory problems, airway obstruction. Respiratory arrest.
- 3. Unconsciousness. Heart and circulatory problems. Cardiac arrest.
- 4. External and internal bleeding. Shock.
- 5. Thermal injuries. Burns. Heat illness. Electrical and chemical injuries. Cold exposure. Frostbite.
- 6. Chest and abdominal injuries. Pneumothorax.
- 7. Head and spinal injuries. Injuries of the locomotor system.

Practical lessons:

- 1. Guidelines and basic steps of first aid. Treatment of acute airway obstruction.
- 2. Principles of adult basic life support. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR).
- 3. Infant and child basic life support.
- 4. Bleeding control. Shock treatment. Positioning.
- 5. Basic principles of dressing and bandaging. Bandaging techniques I.
- 6. Bandaging techniques II.
- 7. Practical exam.

Credit and exam requirements:

- minimum 80% presence, practical knowledge of CPR and bandaging techniques.
- practical exam, theoretical exam.
